Title

Rom 12:3-8

3 For I say, through the grace given to me, to everyone who is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think soberly, as God has dealt to each one a measure of faith.

4 For as we have many members in one body, but all the members do not have the same function,

5 so we, being many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another.

6 Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, let us prophesy in proportion to our faith:

7 or ministry, let us use it in our ministering; he who teaches, in teaching;

8 he who exhorts, in exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness.

Part of the process to developing Redemptive Gifts, is to value & embrace COMMUNITY (ref.) Rom 12:4-5

Isa 61:1-3

- 1 "The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon Me, Because the LORD has anointed Me To preach good tidings to the poor; He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted, To proclaim liberty to the captives, And the opening of the prison to those who are bound;
- 2 To proclaim the acceptable year of the LORD, And the day of vengeance of our God; To comfort all who mourn,
- 3 To console those who mourn in Zion, To give them beauty for ashes, The oil of joy for mourning, The garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness; That they may be called trees of righteousness, The planting of the LORD, that He may be glorified."

PLANTING H4302 mattâ' mat-taw' something planted, that is, the place (a garden or vineyard), or the thing (a plant, figuratively of men)

from **H5193** to *strike* in, that is, *fix*; specifically to *plant* (literally or figuratively): - fastened, plant (-er).

Both the Garden & the Trees

Gen 2:7-8

- **7** And the LORD God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living being.
- 8 The LORD God planted a garden eastward in Eden, and there He put the man whom He had formed.

Jer 17:7-8

- 7 "Blessed is the man who trusts in the LORD, And whose hope is the LORD.
- 8 For he shall be like a tree planted by the waters, Which spreads out its roots by the river, And will not fear when heat comes; But its leaf will be green, And will not be anxious in the year of drought, Nor will cease from yielding fruit.

Part of the process to maturing Redemptive Gifts, is to value & embrace COMMUNITY

(ref.) 1Co 12:18 But now God has set the members, each one of them, in the body just as He pleased.

SET G5087 tithēmi *tith'-ay-mee* to *place* (in ...an upright and active position...): settle, sink down.

(homework ref.) Psa 1:1-3

3 ...And whatever he does shall prosper.

Giver Redemptive

<u>GIVE</u> **G3330** metadidōmi to *give over*, that is, *share:* - impart.

Behavioral Characteristics

- Versatile and adaptable, flexible
- Generational worldview (not only concerned with their own life, but intentionally try to prepare the way for their family after them)

Redemptive Gifts

- Nurturing deeply committed to family
- Have a heart for evangelism, but do not generally want to "pick the fruit"
- Relates to a wide range of people
- Money and favor come to them
- Can sustain tense relationships
 without bringing them to closure –
 they agree to disagree easily

Undeveloped Giver

Gives only in time of abundance.

Developed Giver Redemptive

Gives wisely to establish ministries in their time of abundance and in their time of need.

Undeveloped Giver

Can be overly cautious. Makes decisions based on fear rather than faith. They can not birth new things.

Developed Giver Redemptive

Trusts God to deliver what He has promised. Willing to take financial risks based on faith instead of always waiting for the safe deal.

Undeveloped Giver

Can be too frugal with family members, or too generous with the intent to control.

Developed Giver Redemptive

Balanced generosity – stands against the destructive forces of excess and indulgence.

Undeveloped Giver

be independent the Can to extreme. May try to live independent of God - this lack of relationship can cause the undeveloped Giver to walk in fear and mistrust.

Developed Giver Redemptive

Dependent on God, walks in strong relationship with God instead of relying on themselves.

Undeveloped Giver

Can become a hoarder and places their trust and security in money & possessions. They do not see themselves as a conduit for God. Puts trust in the extended family.

Redemptive Gifts

Developed Giver Redemptive

Trusts God, & sees themselves as His conduit of blessing.

Undeveloped Giver

Walks out their faith like a business contract, keeping their "end of the bargain." Has a tendency to be traditional.

Developed Giver Redemptive

No longer uses religious activities to please God, but walks in a true (heartfelt) love relationship with Him. They embrace the "new wine."

Undeveloped Giver

Can use emotional manipulations to try and control family members. They can be very petty.

Developed Giver Redemptive

They develop healthy, life-giving relationships within their immediate family.

Undeveloped Giver

Can be suspicious and fearful of what might happen. They build protective "structures" based on fear.

Developed Giver Redemptive

Builds & provides for the future based on faith

Undeveloped Giver

Doesn't accept God's absolutes & wants to keep their options open.

Developed Giver Redemptive

Led by the Holy Spirit & is not casual about God's absolutes.

Undeveloped Giver

Does not learn from the past well, makes the same mistakes over and over, and considers each situation as unique and different. Resents being confronted about their patterns, mistakes, & things from their past.

Developed Giver Redemptive

Accepts responsibility for past mistakes. They are willing to make amends, & acknowledges unhealthy patterns.

Undeveloped Giver

Scrooge

Developed Giver Redemptive

It is their birthright to impart generational blessings of wealth and favor (like Abraham). They also have authority to guard new programs & ministries through intercession. They impart blessing at the beginning of a project and ministry.
